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Discussion on "The Teaching Methods of Assamese and Various Aspects of the Language" Date: 22/05/2024 Venue: College Conference Hall (An Initiative of the Assamese Department with the IQAC)

The Assamese Department of Tyagbir Hem Baruah College organized an academic discussion on 22/05/2024 regarding *The Teaching Methods of Assamese and the Various Aspects of the Language*. The discussion aimed to examine the pedagogy surrounding Assamese language teaching, while also exploring its various dialects, cultural dimensions, and academic significance. The event was conducted as part of the department's ongoing initiatives to promote greater understanding and appreciation of the Assamese language among students.

The session included paper presentations from students enrolled in the Integrated Teacher Education Programme (ITEP) and enlightening discussions led by the faculty members of the Assamese Department. The academic discussion was marked by active participation from both students and faculty, culminating in a thoughtful dialogue on how the language can be taught more effectively and the areas where it requires further exploration. The programme began with student paper presentations, where the ITEP students shared their research on various aspects of the Assamese language highlighing how language preservation plays a pivotal role in maintaining the rich cultural heritage of Assam, stressing the importance of promoting the Assamese language in both formal and informal settings. The discussion traced the historical development of teaching strategies employed for the Assamese language, from traditional oral methods to more modern, communicative approaches.

After the student presentations, the faculty members of the Assamese Department, including Dr. Mukut Kumar Sonowal, Dr. Chabirani Das, and Dr. Rantu Dutta, led a discussion on the dialectical diversity within Assamese and its implications for language teaching. The professors shared their expertise on the linguistic variations present in different regions of Assam and their impact on language pedagogy.Dr. Mukut Kumar Sonowal highlighted the significance of understanding the phonetic and syntactic variations across Assamese dialects. He explained that the presence of multiple dialects presents both a challenge and an opportunity for educators. He emphasized that teaching should be adaptable, sensitive to dialectal variations, and inclusive of regional linguistic diversity.Dr. Chabirani Das further expanded on the socio-linguistic aspects of Assamese, explaining how language usage is often influenced by social contexts, education levels, and even geographic factors. She encouraged students to conduct research on language usage in different communities and understand its evolving nature.Dr. Rantu Dutta contributed to the discussion by encouraging students to explore the interdisciplinary nature of Assamese studies, particularly how it intersects with cultural studies, literature, and history. She stressed that a well-rounded understanding of Assamese should go beyond linguistics and encompass social, political, and cultural perspectives.

Throughout the session, the faculty members urged the students to continue their academic exploration of the Assamese language. They encouraged them to conduct research in areas like dialectology, language preservation, and innovative teaching methods. The professors also underscored the importance of embracing



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both traditional and modern approaches in language instruction to make Assamese teaching more effective in the contemporary classroom.

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


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Celebration of 59th Annual College Week, 2023-2024 <u>From February 5 to 10, 2024</u>
